We are delighted to announce the first Joint National Security Law Workshop between Emory Law School, the U.S. Air Force Judge Advocate General's School, and The Judge Advocate General's Legal Center and School of the U.S. Army!

This workshop is an exciting opportunity for students from each of the three schools to present and discuss papers on topics in national security law and international law with each other and with leading experts in the field. Presenters will benefit from the perspectives of national security law experts, collaboration with other interested authors, and accompanying discussions concerning the possibility of publication.

The workshop will be on Saturday, April 13, 2019 at the Air Force Judge Advocate General's School, Maxwell Air Force Base, Montgomery, Alabama. Papers can be on any topic related to national security law or international law. Eligible applicants include students currently enrolled at any of the three schools, as well as other judge advocates enrolled in LL.M. programs or other resident military intermediate development education programs.

All entries are due by 1630 hours (4:30 p.m.) Central Time on **January 15, 2019**. Email submissions should note **Joint National Security Law Workshop Paper Submission** in the subject line.

Entries should be near-final versions of the authors' work, though it is expected that authors may later wish to revise their papers to incorporate workshop feedback. Only original and previously unpublished papers are eligible. Papers prepared for academic credit are eligible provided they are original work. Jointly authored papers are not eligible. Entrants can have others review and critique their work, but the submission must be the entrant's own product. Only one paper may be submitted per entrant.

Entries may be of any length, though it is expected that entries selected to present at the workshop will be of standard law review or law journal comment length. Sources should be cited in footnotes according to *The Bluebook: A Uniform System of Citation*. Each submission must include a separate cover page with the entrant's name, mailing and e-mail addresses, and phone number; the entrant's name and other identifying markings must not appear on any other page of the submitted entry. A panel of experts from Emory Law School and the service schools will select the papers invited for presentation at the workshop, while maximizing representation from participating institutions.
