



## Department of the Air Force Military Spouse Attorney Hiring Program

Military spouses who are licensed attorneys may request to participate in the Air Force Judge Advocate General's Corps' (AFJAGC) Military Spouse Attorney Hiring Program.

- To participate in the program, attorneys must submit an application (and attachments) to [AFPC.Legal.CFT@us.af.mil](mailto:AFPC.Legal.CFT@us.af.mil). The application is found at <http://www.afjag.af.mil>.
- The Legal Civilian Career Field Team (CFT) will share the attorney's contact information and resume with Department of the Air Force legal offices seeking to hire a civilian attorney in their local area.
- Participating attorneys are not guaranteed employment with the Department of the Air Force. However, if a military spouse attorney is qualified and selected for a position, the legal office may use non-competitive procedures to hire the military spouse.

### Eligibility

- Graduate of a law school accredited by the American Bar Association and have the first professional law degree
- Licensed attorney in good standing and active bar status of a state, territory of the United States, District of Columbia, or Commonwealth of Puerto Rico
- Married to a military sponsor currently in the Regular component of any branch of service with over six (6) months remaining on orders at the location for which employment is being sought
- Live in or have orders to the local commuting area of the position via permanent change of station (PCS) orders
- Not be currently employed by a DoD legal office within the local commuting area
- Meet qualification standards and legal experience requirements for the position
